The Rose Parade may be Pasadena's pride and joy, but Galt had the opportunity to be represented in the nationally recognized annual event.

The 35-foot-long, 16-foottall float was an artistic replica of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Virginia. A bald eagle fronted the float, which included a replica of the tomb complete with two former tomb guards brought out of retirement to assume a post on the parade float. Representatives from each of the country's military manned the float with soldiers from the Army, Marines, Coast Guard and Air Force, of which Delaney belongs. Joining Delaney and her comrades at arms were two wounded soldiers.

"This was an honor and privilege to be a part of such a remarkable event," said Delaney. "This is an experience I will never forget."

Stationed in Alabama, Delaney flew into California just days before the parade and was able to help with the finishing touches on the float.
